

## **Martin Luther King Day Events Planned at The University of Scranton**

University of Scranton's Office of Multicultural Affairs has planned several events to commemorate Martin Luther King Day on Monday, January 17.

The university's Office of Multicultural Affairs and Friends of the Poor will host a performance by University of Scranton students of "Pilgrim Prophet - Journey of Justice and A Path to Peace." The public is invited to the free performance, which will be held in the Eagen Auditorium of the Gunster Student Center at 10:30 a.m. Also, at 8 a.m. and noon the university will sound the bell in the Redington Hall Carillon.

At noon, the University of Scranton and the United Neighborhood Center will host a presentation of "Keeping the Idol Real" facilitated by Robert W. Hoffman, Jr. The presentation, also free and open to the public, will be held at the United Neighborhood Progressive Center, 414 Olive Street. The program will end at 4:30 p.m.

At 5:30 p.m., The University of Scranton and the United Neighborhood Center have organized a "Freedom March to City Hall," from the center on Olive Street to Mulberry Street to City Hall, where Scranton Mayor Chris Doherty will read the Mayor's Proclamation for Martin Luther King Day.

At 7:00 p.m., there will be a service in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. at the Bethel A.M.E. Church, 716 N. Washington Avenue.

On Saturday, February 12, the university's United Colors Club and the Council for Community Affairs, Inc., will host the 16th Annual Martin Luther King Jr. Scholarship Dinner in the 5th floor Executive Center of Brennan Hall. The guest speaker is Mannwell Glenn, executive director of the Governor's Advisory Commission for African American Affairs. A reception will take place at 6 p.m., followed by dinner.
